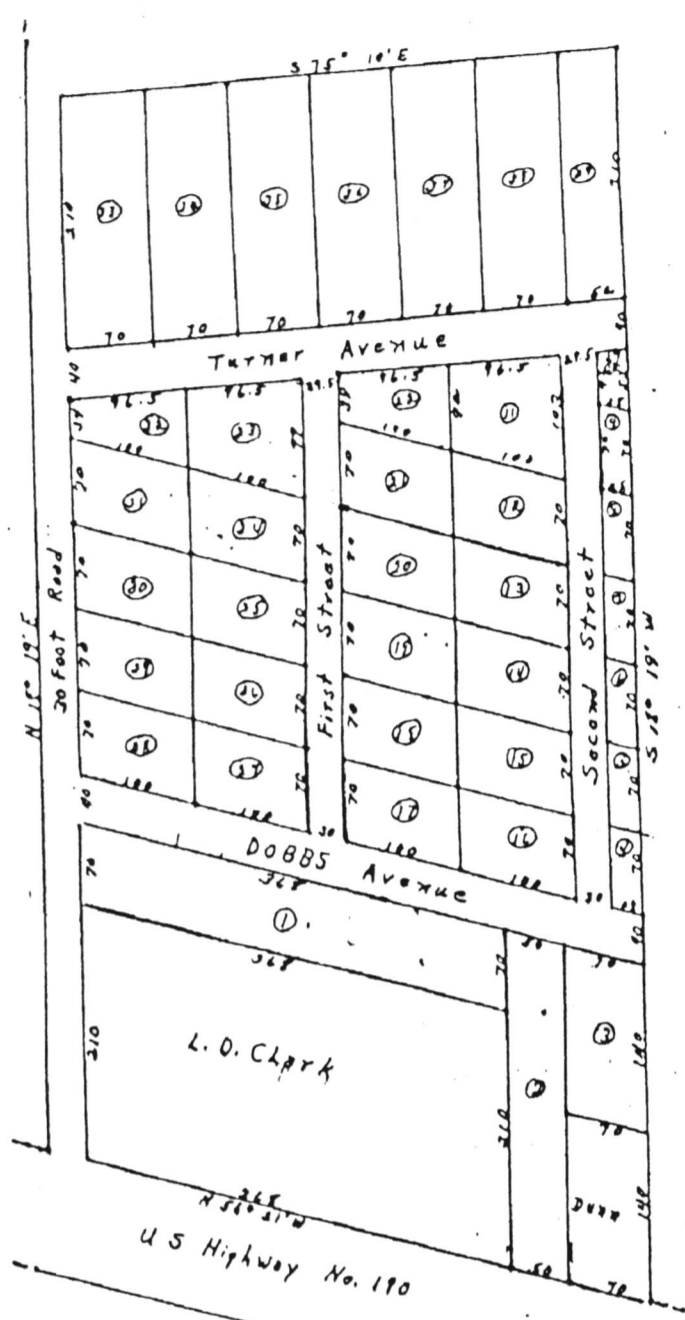


COUNTY OF BELL
